# **EMERGENCY SHELTER**

Central lowa Shelter & Services is one of the largest low-barrier shelters in the state of lowa for individuals over the age of 18 years old.


We have the capacity to accommodate over 300 individuals each night in our emergency shelter.

Founded on the principle of never turning people away, our staff works tirelessly to ensure our neighbors experiencing homelessness are given respite in their time of need.



# **SUPPORTED HOUSING**

**Central Iowa Shelter & Services' campus hosts 62 single-unit efficiency apartments.** These apartments allow clients to build positive rental histories, learn how to care for a place of their own, and get on their feet so they can secure permanent housing.



### **VETERAN HOUSING**

Central Iowa Shelter & Services, in partnership with Veterans Affairs, offers a total of 19 single-unit efficiency apartments for Veterans transitioning to to stable housing or in need of short-term transitional housing.

# STREET OUTREACH

In the face of extreme Iowa temperatures that pose a significant threat to vulnerable populations like the unsheltered, the CISS Street Outreach Team exemplifies unwavering dedication and effort. This team is at the heart of two essential services that provide critical support to those in need.

#### **HOUSING FOR SHELTER INTAKES**

The team offers comprehensive support to individuals entering emergency shelters. They work closely with these individuals to craft tailored housing plans, assist with locating vital documents, and strive to secure housing within the first 14 days of their stay. **Together, the team conducted a total of 1802 shelter intakes.** 

#### STREET OUTREACH

Team members visit unsheltered camps throughout Des Moines a few times each week. During these visits, they distribute clean drinking water and conduct thorough assessments of each situation, ensuring that anyone in need of medical care or additional assistance from CISS receives the help they need. The Street Outreach Team's relentless efforts served 70 unhoused individuals, securing housing for 90% of those individuals.

# **ROLLING HILLS COALITION**

Our Rolling Hills Coalition Team serves a total of 15 rural counties throughout central lowa. By assisting with a person's search for housing, a deposit, first month's rent, and landlord communications, our RHC Team is able to help people find housing in their area near their support system.

The Rolling Hills Team successfully helped a total of 365 individuals find housing in their area.

# **CLOTHING CLOSET**

Central Iowa Shelter & Services' community clothing closet is a vital resource, offering free shoes and clothing to the public.

It spreads hope and dignity by providing community members and shelter clients with sturdy shoes and appropriate attire. These essentials support individuals in their daily lives, whether they're seeking employment, attending job interviews, or braving the harsh lowa weather.

By ensuring access to shoes that fit properly and clothing suitable for work and personal protection, the clothing closet helps empower individuals to build a better future.

# **FOOD PANTRY**

Central lowa Shelter & Services' community food pantry is a crucial resource for those in need, supported by Ithe Food Bank of Iowa, DMARC, and public donations.

Operated by volunteers and AARP employees training to enter or re-enter the workforce, the pantry ensures access to nutritious food while also providing valuable work experience.

By addressing food insecurity and contributing to workforce development, the pantry strengthens community resilience and fosters a supportive environment for both recipients and volunteers alike.







Growth Financial Services is a subsidiary of CISS that assists individuals with identifying and meeting their financial goals. This includes learning to use their paycheck to pay bills, build a savings account, pay down debt or past due bills, and work toward financial stability and independence.

Ensuring basic needs are taken care of is the first priority, including food, shelter, clothing and medical and dental expenses. Once those items are covered, clients learn how to budget, save, and separate out a monthly "allowance" based on income. This service is offered to anyone who would like this type of assistance, whether they are a shelter client or not.





In the past year, Central Iowa Shelter and Services saw a strong and diverse income stream. Government funding represented 52% of total revenue, providing a solid foundation for our operations. Private contributions made up 45%, highlighting the generous support from individuals, foundations, and businesses in our community. Along with these, in-kind donations added another 4%. This balanced funding mix underscores the vital role played by both public and private partners in enabling us to serve those experiencing homelessness in Central Iowa.
